

My Dear Grandchild,

I do not understand the reason that so many people are continuing to criticise the actions of the President of the Philippines, Mrs Gloria Macapagal Arroyo, in pulling all of her fifty one troops out of Iraq in order to meet the demands of the kidnappers of a Philippine lorry driver, Mr Angelo de la Cruz. What is one to expect from Philippine nationals, who, over the years, have been programmed to wash floors, clean windows and clothes, look after elderly people, and perform other menial household chores where one does not have to think too much? The brain of a homo sapien, once programmed, tends to resist reprogramming, you know. It requires some time to enable it to accept new commands. Now that the terrorists of Iraq have won the day with regard to the Government of the Philippines, they will, naturally, expect to be able to employ the same tactics when kidnapping the nationals of other countries, making demands for countries to stop, being part of the US-led coalition in Iraq.
