## HON PO GROUP (LOBSTER KING) LTD: FORMER EMPLOYEE PETITIONS THE WINDING UP OF A SUBSIDIARY

A person by the name of Choi Yuet Seung, formerly in the employ of a wholly owned subsidiary of <u>Hon Po</u> <u>Group (Lobster King) Ltd</u> (Code: 228, Main Board, The Stock Exchange of Hongkong Ltd) has applied to the Legal Aid Department of the Government of the Hongkong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) of the People's Republic of China (PRC) to assist in getting back wages.

This action followed an application to The Labour Tribunal where judgment was rendered in Claimant's favour.

And, today, Milibless International Development Ltd, the wholly owned subsidiary of Hon Po Group (Lobster King) is the recipient of Winding-Up Proceedings Number 916.

Milibless International used to be the holding company of a Kowloon City Chinese restaurant, which was closed, earlier this year.

Choi Yuet Seung was one of the former employees of this restaurant, who was made redundant with its closure.

In addition to the Kowloon City restaurant, Hon Po Group (Lobster King), also, shut the doors on its Kwaichung restaurant.

A sum of not less than \$HK6.33 million was the Contingent Liabilities in respect of the closure of these 2 restaurants with regard to employees' long service payments and accrued salaries and wages.

The actions of Choi Yuet Seung come in the wake of entities of Hon Po Group (Lobster King), being sued 7 times in various Courts of the HKSAR since March this year, with the aggregate amount of money claimed, being in the region of \$HK2 million.
