

My Dear Grandchild,

Some years ago, the former Urban Council promoted an art exhibition. To this end, the Urban Council imported, on loan, some of the old-world masterpieces. One of the works on display was a copy of Michelangelo's David. Of course, David was a nude statue, complete with a flaccid penis. It was considered, then, and still today, to be an example of one of the best works of this renowned Italian sculptor. Clearly, Christians must be proscribed at looking at penises). In the Motherland, today, there is a clampdown on what is considered pornography on the Internet. In the first cyberporn criminal case in the Motherland, a Ms Wang Yan Li was jailed for four years for running a website, which displayed ladies, taking off their clothes. And so, I am wondering, today: Who determines what is pornography and what is art in the Motherland? I remember a chat that I had with a member of the Seventh Day Adventist (cult), some years ago, a Dr William Andress, who used to work at Adventist Hospital in Hongkong. He used to teach health and wellness, there. According to Dr William Andress, watching pornography is bad for people because it becomes a habit. Dr William Andress, also, told me that homosexuality was horrible and it is an affront to God. He explained to me that only homo sapiens indulge in such abominable sexual activities. The Bible, he told me, considers homosexuality to be an abomination.
