It came a little quicker than **TARGET** had anticipated, but the closing act of the Deborah Anne Sims's 'play' is being staged at her last, remaining corporate offices in the Hongkong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) of the People's Republic of China (PRC).

As is her wont, over the years, Ms <u>Deborah Anne Sims</u>, once considered a close runner-up for the title of doyenne of the hoity-toity of the HKSAR, when the going got tough, she tended not to pay all that was due to her loyal and adoring staff, as well as stiffing the corporate landlords where her businesses were being conducted.

With the closure of her other interests, namely Body by Deborah International Health and Beauty Spa, which went belly up in March 2002, leaving tens of millions of dollars, owing to various parties, she embarked on selling painted ostrich eggs, imported from Thailand.

That was a failure, too.

However, TARGET has never been able to track down the unsold ostrich eggs, painted or otherwise.

Then came the next attempt to earn a crust from her home base: She determined to establish a BOTOX haven.

According to **TOLFIN** (The Computerised Online Financial Intelligence Service and Web-Based, Credit-Checking Provider), New Team International Ltd, the holding company of the business, known as The Face Magic Haven (aka the BOTOX shop), New Team International has failed to pay rent on its office unit since August 2004.

The monthly rental on the BOTOX shop is about \$HK20,000.
