

## My Dear Grandchild,

I recall that, when I was in school, it was mandatory that we studied literature for at least one semester. I took English Literature and, of course, ended up studying William Shakespeare's works. I recall one famous line from the play, Julius Caesar: 'The evil that men do lives after them; the good is oft interred in their bones.'
