GARMENT MANUFACTURERS FACE CRITICAL TIMES: KNITTING FACTORY CLOSES DOWN – BANKRUPTCY PETITIONS LODGED

Say Goodbye To Winson Knitting Industrial Company Ltd

A group of companies, domiciled in the Hongkong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) of the People's Republic of China (PRC) and engaged in knitting operations, primarily, appears to have closed up shop, with 2 of the principle players, facing bankruptcy proceedings.

Winson Knitting Industrial Company Ltd, founded in June 1992, is a key company in this group of <u>garment and trading companies</u>, which is, now, clearly, no longer operational, according to **TARGET**'s extensive enquiries.

The companies, within this group comprise:

- 1. Winson Knitting Industrial Company Ltd, which trades under the name of Darius Trading Company;
- 2. Darius Knitting Factory Ltd;
- 3. KSM Ltd; and,
- 4. Weon Ltd.

All of the above-mentioned companies, along with their shareholders and directors, have been named in a number of lawsuits, issued recently in the HKSAR.

The following is a complete breakdown of the companies and the principle parties, confirmed to be the personalities behind the above-mentioned companies, according to the database of **TOLFIN** (The Computerised Online Financial Intelligence Service and Web-Based, Credit-Checking Provider):
