

## My Dear Grandchild,

I was really tickled when I read that California's Governor, Mr Arnold Schwarzenegger, had taken umbrage when his Austrian hometown of Graz – one of the five largest cities in Austria, by the way – severely criticised him for his decision to allow the execution of convicted killer, Stanley Tookie Williams, on December 13, 2005, to take place.
