BYRON INTERNATIONAL'S CHIEF ACCUSED OF ISSUING \$HK1-MILLION RUBBER CHEQUE

There has been a terrible falling out in the <u>Alain Guernier</u> Camp, with one of Mr Guernier's partners, throwing down the gauntlet in what is, apparently, a show of extreme ire.

This is the latest episode in the litigation saga of Mr Alain Guernier and his Byron International Hotels Ltd, a saga which stretches over the past 4 years.

Mr Keung is alleging that Mr Guernier gave a \$HK1-million cheque to Mr Keung, drawn on Standard Chartered Bank, Peking Road Branch, dated March 27, 1999, but, when the cheque was presented for payment, it was dishonoured.

Mr Keung wants his money back; and, he has sicked his lawyers on Mr Guernier's case.
